Total Nonfarm Employment Increased by 69,600 Jobs Year Over Year in March 2024 Arizona Unemployment Decreased to 3.8%

The Arizona seasonally adjusted (SA) unemployment rate decreased to 3.8% in March 2024 from 4.1% in February 2024. The U.S. SA unemployment rate decreased to 3.8% in March 2024 from 3.9% in February 2024.

Month over month, Arizona's SA labor force increased by 2,865 individuals, or 0.1%. Year over year, the SA labor force increased by 74,982 individuals, or 2.0%.

Month over month, Arizona not-seasonally adjusted (NSA) total nonfarm employment increased by 1,900 jobs. Year over year, NSA total nonfarm employment increased by 69,600 jobs, or 2.2%. Arizona SA total nonfarm employment increased by 8,700 individuals, or 0.3%, month over month.

Month Over Month

Arizona NSA nonfarm employment increased by 1,900 jobs in March. Prior to the pandemic (2010-2019), NSA nonfarm employment gained 10,800 jobs on average in March. The private sector recorded a gain of 1,100 jobs in March, led by gains in Leisure & Hospitality (1,700 jobs) and Trade, Transportation & Utilities (1,400 jobs). Prior to the pandemic (2010-2019), private sector employment averaged a gain of 11,200 jobs in March. The government sector¹ recorded a gain of 800 jobs in March, more than the pre-pandemic (2010-2019) average loss of 400 jobs. Employment gains in the government sector occurred primarily within Other Local Government (1,000 jobs).

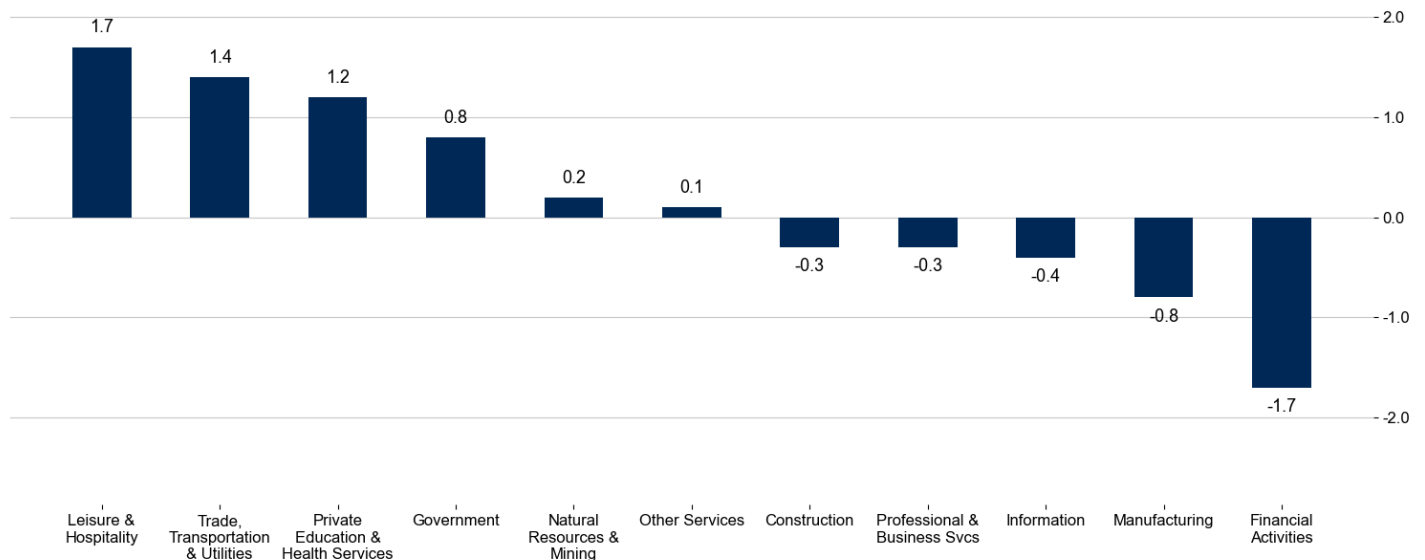

Arizona NSA nonfarm employment increased by 69,600 jobs or 2.2% in March year over year. Private sector employment increased by 56,000 jobs year over year, while government employment increased by 13,600 jobs year over year.

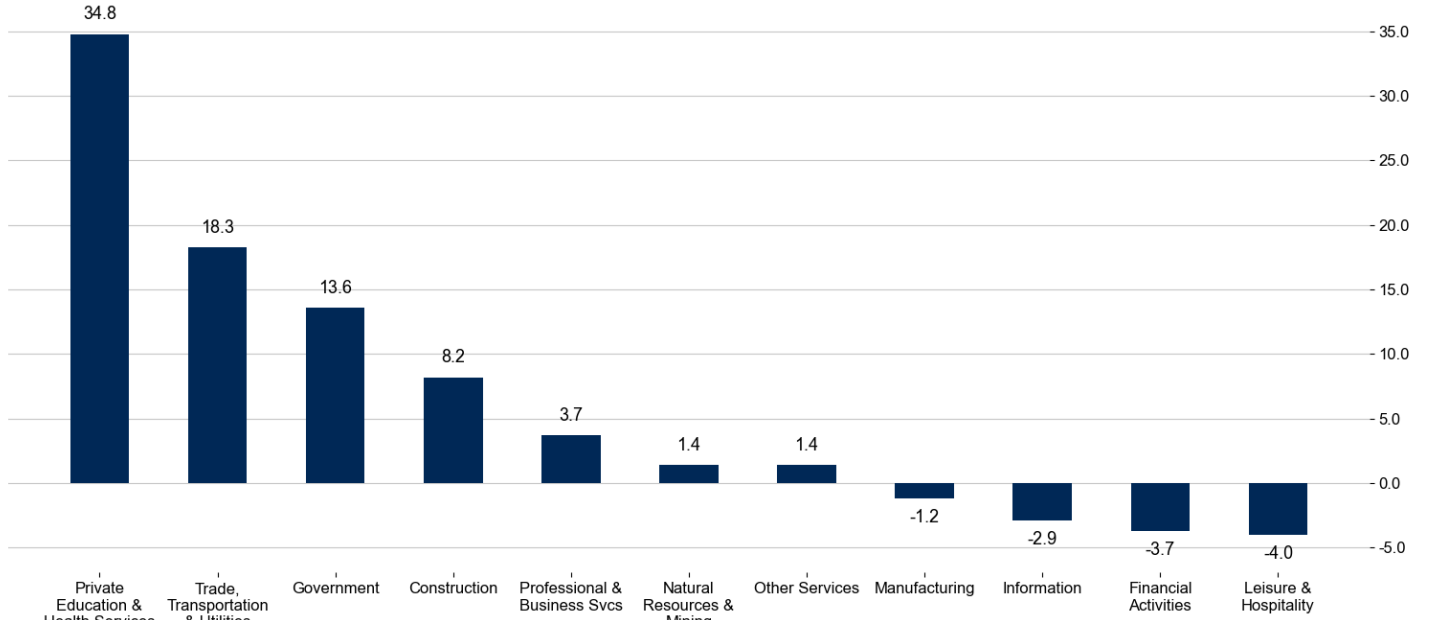

Arizona NSA Year-Over-Year Employment Gain/Loss by Sector

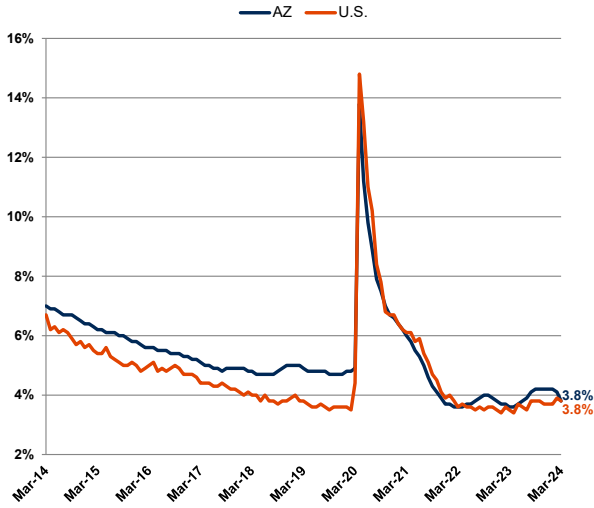

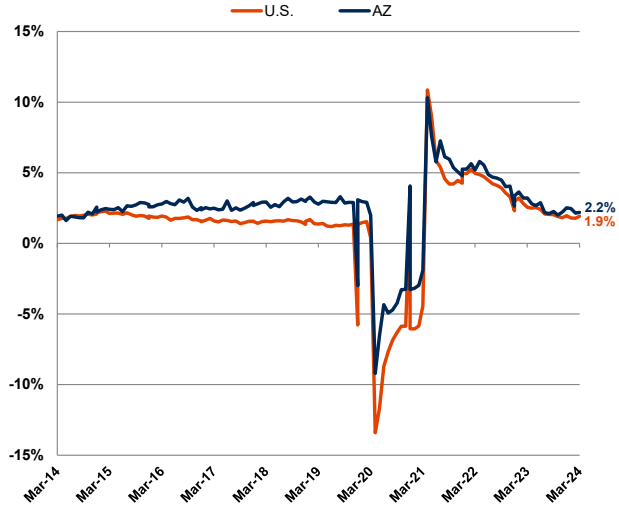

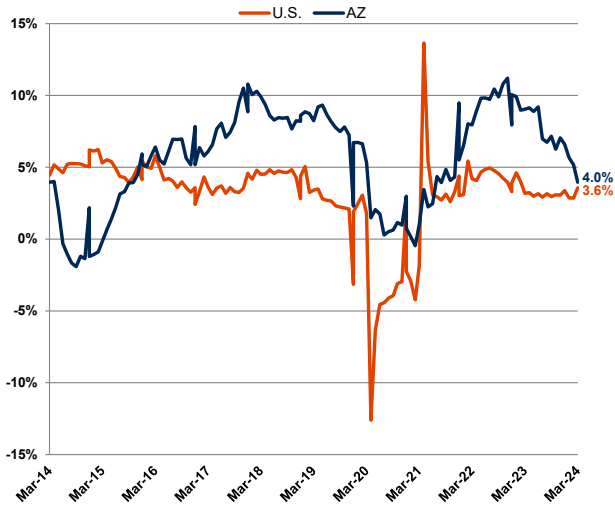
Arizona & U.S. Unemployment Rate
Seasonally Adjusted



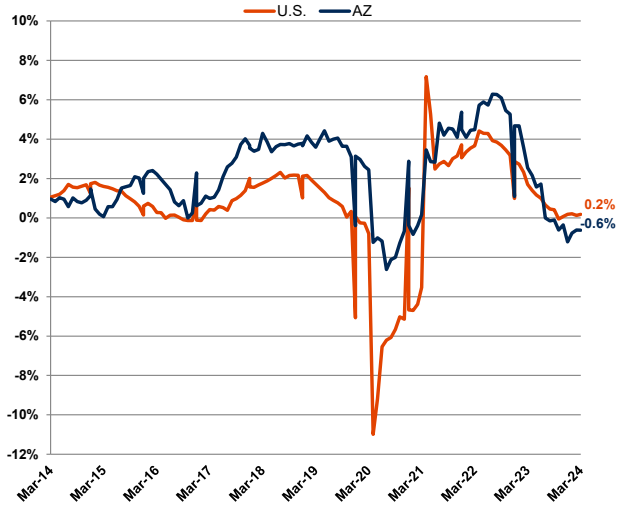
Arizona & U.S. Nonfarm Employment

Year-to-Year Percent Change



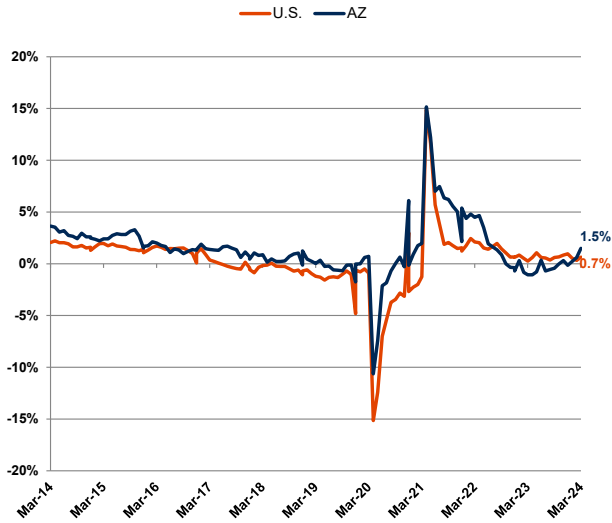
Arizona & U.S. Manufacturing Employment
Year-to-Year Percent Change



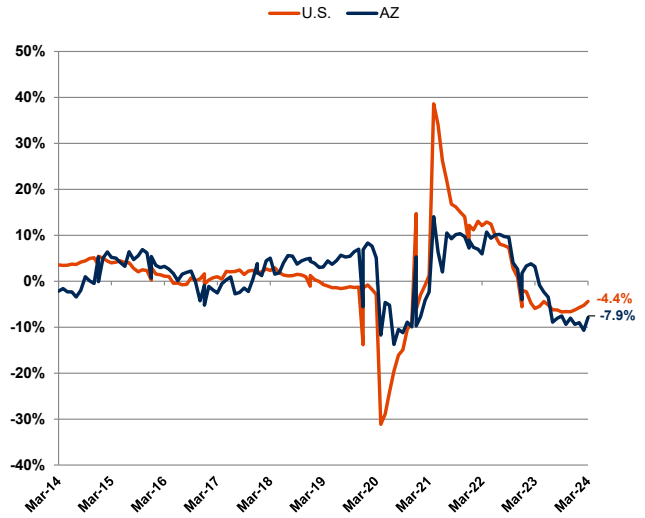

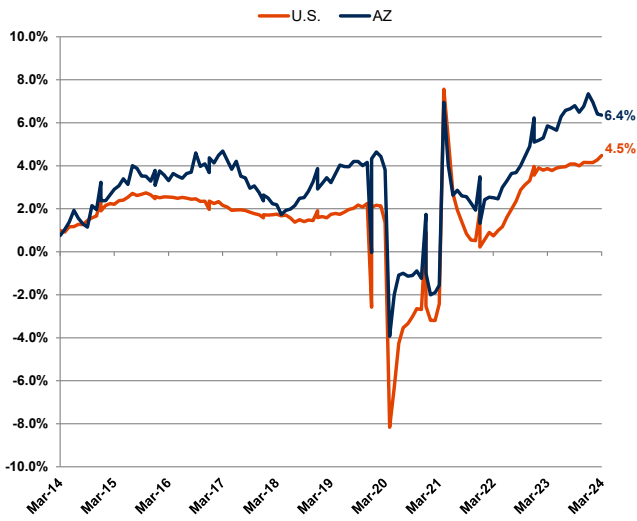
Arizona & U.S. Retail Trade
Year-to-Year Percent Change



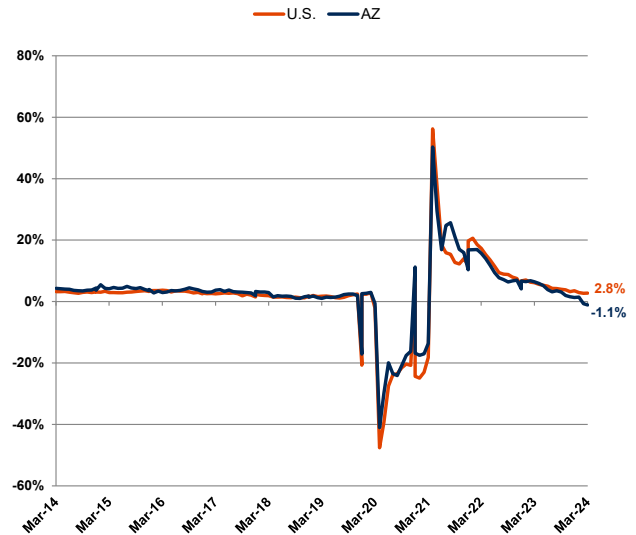
Arizona & U.S. Employment Services
